Translation:

Berassäd (beressäd) comes from the Persian word *ressändan*, meaning to deliver. At the end of our prayers, we get help and energy from all the Angels (Ēzadän and Ameshäspendän) and God to accept our prayers.

Guide to diacritical marks:

ā	“ay” sound as in day
ē	“ee” sound as in bead, sleep
ī	“ii” sound as in site
ō	“oh” sound as in snow
ä	“ah” sound as in bother or cot
ü	“oo” sound as in shoe, moose, or rule
a	“a” sound as in cap or had
e or é	“eh” sound as in head or set
